Saint Elizabeth Community Awarded Grants for Elder Abuse Program

The Office on Violence Against Women, U.S. Department of Justice, awarded Saint Elizabeth Community \$400,000 in funding under the Enhanced Training and Services to End Abuse in Later Life Program. This grant will increase and strengthen training about abuse against older individuals, including cross-training of governmental and non-governmental organizations; it will provide, or enhance services for older victims of abuse, and create or support multi-disciplinary collaborative community response to older victims.

Additionally, Saint Elizabeth Community was awarded a \$140,000 grant from Victims of Crime Act Administrators (VOCA). Roberta Merkle, Vice President of Strategic Initiatives, Saint Elizabeth Community says, "With the support of VOCA, the program has grown significantly, and allowed for temporary shelter to elderly victims of abuse, and we have expanded case management and advocacy services with this funding."



"We are thrilled to receive both the Department of Justice and the VOCA grants," says Steven J. Horowitz, President and CEO, Saint Elizabeth Community. "Working collaboratively with a multitude of organizations, Saint Elizabeth Community works to end abuse in Rhode Island of older adults. These grants will go a long way in helping our state reach this goal."

In 2009 Saint Elizabeth Community established the Saint Elizabeth Haven Program for Elder Justice to offer safe haven to elderly victims of abuse and to raise awareness of this horrible crime.

Patenaud Honored







Over the Top




