She got to know Nick so well that she began to incorporate some of his favorite things into their therapy sessions. One time, Julie brought a putter and had Nick putting in the yard."

"Nick has worked so hard to get where he is today," shared Julie. "Though he continues to work on his memory regarding day to day routines, he REMEMBERED the game. His swing and game even improved throughout the day despite increasing fatigue!"

Elder Abuse Awareness Breakfast

Nearly 150 community champions gathered at Saint Elizabeth Community's World Elder Abuse Awareness Breakfast on Wednesday, June 15th. This annual event is an opportunity to increase awareness about the issue of elder abuse and to celebrate the dedication and hard work of those who work together in the community to give elders a voice.

"Seeing everyone together was truly amazing," begins Roberta Merkle, Executive Vice President of Strategic Initiatives. "We started on this journey together many years ago and everyone in the room played a part in creating a more coordinated and collaborative system to protect older adults."

In 2018, Saint Elizabeth Community was awarded a \$400,000 federal grant from the Office of Violence Against Women to coordinate and deliver a training program for law enforcement and social service staff. As a result of this grant and the efforts of Saint Elizabeth Haven for Elder Justice more than 1,000 field staff have been trained to better understand the various types of elder abuse and Rhode Island Elder Abuse law.

"Elder abuse in our country, and in Rhode Island, remains a 'silent epidemic'.

Only one in ten incidences of abuse are ever reported," begins Jeanne
Gattegno, Program Director, Saint Elizabeth Haven for Elder Justice.

"This groundbreaking training helps those in the field to identify the signs of elder abuse, understand the community resources available to elder victims and how to best to fulfill the requirements of reporting abuse for thorough investigations by the Office of Healthy Aging.

We have all come so far in bringing this issue to light, but there is more work that needs to be done to protect this vulnerable population."




