Living in Harmony: Care & Comfort at Our Adult Day Center

In a cozy home in Cranston, the warmth shared between Raymond Washington and his wife, Maria, is immediate and heartening. Married for 32 years, the couple has built a life grounded in faith, love, travel, and music. These days, they share their home with their two daughters, Maria and Elizabeth, as well as their beloved senior dog, Iris.

Raymond is a proud U.S. Air Force Veteran who was drafted on his 19th birthday in 1965 and served during the Vietnam Era as an Administrative Clerk.

At age 64, following a diagnosis of multiple sclerosis, Ray's daily routine shifted significantly. He now uses a walker and requires assistance with daily living activities.

In 2024, the Washington family sought a nearby licensed adult day center to give them a helping hand. They discovered that all four Saint Elizabeth Adult Day Centers accepted eligible Veteran benefits covering services for two days a week.

The Apponaug Center was close to their home and the family scheduled a tour with Eileen Unger, Case Manager, who addressed all of their questions. They quickly realized that Ray would thrive in this new environment.

"We knew it was the right fit," Maria says.
"It gave both of us the peace of mind we were looking for."

Now, every Tuesday and Thursday begins the same way: Ray descends the stairs using his electric chair lift, exits his home via a ramp built into the front porch, and is greeted by a friendly transportation driver. By the time he reaches the center, he's already shared a few laughs.

"I go in happy, and I come home happy," Ray beams.

At the center, he's a vibrant part of the community. His sense of humor and unmatched talent for music trivia have made him a fan favorite. Each morning kicks off with a lively game of Uno, and Ray is known for singing along when lyrics pop up in conversation. "There's a 95-year-old Veteran I talk with—he's got incredible stories from the Korean War. We learn so much from one another." Ray shares.

Ray's daughter Maria sees the impact: "My dad thrives on the social piece—meeting peers outside of the house balances his life. He especially loves Music Therapy, and the staff makes sure he never misses it."

Ray's time at the Apponaug Center also provides his wife, Maria, with time off from caregiving. She notes, "When Ray attends the adult day center, I can get a break and get things done knowing he is in good hands and that I do not need to worry. The nurse will call me if there is a concern; everyone is so nice." This combination supports Ray's desire to age in place while ensuring both he and Maria receive the care and support they need.

After Ray returns home from his day at the center, he and Maria sit together at their kitchen table, sharing tea and crackers as they talk about their day. This cherished routine underscores how adult day services have enriched the Washington family's daily life, providing both support and harmony.
